Junior Division: Age 13 & under; Senior Division: Age 14-18 (Pre-College) • Ages are as of March 31, 2019

AWARDS:

<u>Junior Division:</u> \$300 first prize and performance award*, \$200 second prize, \$100 third prize <u>Senior Division:</u> \$500 first prize and performance award*, \$300 second prize, \$200 third prize

* Performance award: first place winners will be recognized at the opening concert (March 31 at 7:30) and have their performance uploaded on the Society website

ELIGIBILITY:

Open to pre-college students ages 18 and under. Entrants and their teachers must reside in the United States.

REQUIRED REPERTOIRE (2 total selections, Free choice):

- 1 piece** for solo piano by Edvard Grieg
- 1 piece for solo piano by a fin-de-siècle French composer (ca.1870-1930)

A movement of a multi-movement work is considered one piece. All selections must be memorized. Only complete, unabridged, original compositions for solo piano by the composers are allowed. (<u>This includes solo piano arrangements by the composer of his own music</u>, i.e. Grieg's song transcriptions Op. 41 and Op. 52). No cuts are permitted; repeats are at the discretion of the applicant/teacher. Students are encouraged to explore the lesser-known works of Edvard Grieg (i.e. pieces from Op. 17, Op. 41, Op. 52, Op. 66, Op. 72, and less-popular *Lyric Pieces*). There is no time limit for repertoire offered, though contestants may be cut off.

** **NOTE:** Due to the brevity of pieces from Op. 17 and Op. 66, <u>applicants may inquire about offering a small grouping of pieces</u> from either of these two sets in lieu of a longer selection
